**POT PLANTS** must have been the property of the exhibitor for at least three months prior to  
the Show. The same exhibit cannot be shown in more than one class.

**ALL EXHIBITORS must leave the pavilion immediately exhibits have been staged.**

All exhibits must be grown by the exhibitor in the **POT PLANT, ROSE, CUT FLOWER** and  
**ARRANGEMENT OF FLOWERS** Sub-sections, but not necessarily for the Floral Art, Novice,  
Men's Exhibitor or Children's Sub-sections.

Arranging and staging **MUST** be the work of the exhibitor.

Classes 52-62 may include self foliage.

A **VASE** is defined as a vessel the height of which is greater than its breadth.

A **BOWL** is defined as a round vessel the breadth of which is greater than its height.

Dried work must not be exhibited for more than two years.

**PLEASE NOTE: Floriculture judges will be changed every TWO YEARS.**
