CONDITIONS

Classes 1-7 exhibitor must produce a protein statement from a recognised grain buyer.
All exhibits of cereal grain to display varietal name, to be correctly classified and, unless
otherwise stated, exhibited in tins provided by the Society.

Grain which has been pickled will not be eligible for competition.

All collections of green fodders and grasses shall be mounted ready for staging. All
bundles and sheaves must be at least **15cm in diameter** at the tie, and labelled by
variety

The same exhibit cannot be shown in two classes.

Exhibits must be in the hands of the stewards not later than 9:30am, otherwise they will be too late for judging.

Stewards are requested to be in attendance at the pavilion at 8 am to receive entries, and at 5:45 pm to control moving of exhibits at 6 pm.

Exhibits must not be removed until 6 pm.

Entries close with the Secretary no later than 4pm on FRIDAY 29th September 2017

JUDGING WILL COMMENCE at 10 am.

LATE ENTRIES, where accepted, will be \$5 per entry

SCALE OF POINTS FOR JUDGING WHEAT - Weight per hectolitre 25, Protein count 20; Appearance 15; Trueness to Name and Type 10; Uniformity 10; Freedom from Disease 7; Freedom from Foreign Matter 7; Cracked Grain 6 - Total 100.

A statement of protein count to be signed or initialed by a receiving agent in respect of entries in CLASSES 1– 6 ONLY, or an official statement from the Wheat Board of average protein count for year of production in respect of ANY exhibit will be accepted, and must be presented for an exhibitor to attract points for protein quality.

BORDER AG SERVICES MOST OUTSTANDING GRAIN EXHIBIT CASH PRIZE & TROPHY

Cash prize of \$75 and trophy valued at \$25 to be awarded to the most outstanding grain exhibit in classes 1 to 16 as assessed by the judge.

AR SCHILLER MEMORIAL AGGREGATE TROPHY

To be awarded to the exhibitor who gains the highest number of points in this section - three points for each 1st prize, two for 2nd, and one for each entry

DA WURFEL MEMORIAL AGGREGATE - A trophy valued at \$20 has been donated by Paul Wurfel, to be awarded to the exhibitor who gains the highest number of points for the Dry Grain classes Nos. 1-11 inclusive

AWB TROPHY - Valued at \$30

Awarded to the exhibitor who gains the highest number of points for freedom from disease and foreign matter in any one entry, Classes 1-6

CHAMPION WHEAT EXHIBIT (GRAIN) - Society's Certificate

Awarded to the exhibitor of the best sample of wheat in the Pinnaroo Show.

- **ASSOCIATION PRIZE** - MLASA awards a prize of \$30 to the exhibitor who gains the highest number of points in open classes for cereal grains in Association Shows.
Classes eligible are numbers 1-11. Refer to rule 38 (see page 11).

- *1. Wheat, not less than 10kg.
- *2. Wheat, not less than 10kg., variety recommended by Advisory Committee for wheat quality for sowing during season prior to Show, to produce grain for delivery during succeeding harvest in either Zone 2 SA or Silo Group A Vic.
To be grown within 50km of Pinnaroo. (Trophy)
- *3. Wheat, not less than 10kg., early variety.
- *4. Wheat, not less than 10kg., mid season or late variety.
- *5. Wheat, not less than 10kg., ASW variety.
- *6. Wheat, not less than 10kg., Commercial Hard Milling variety.
- *7. Barley, not less than 7kg., Malting variety.
- *8. Barley, not less than 7kg., variety other than Malting.
- *9. Oats, not less than 7kg., variety suitable for production of grain.
- *10. Oats, not less than 7kg., variety suitable for production of hay.
- *11. Triticale, not less than 10kg.
12. Peas, not less than 10kg., variety suitable for grain.
13. Lupins, not less than 10kg., variety suitable for grain.
14. Vetch, not less than 10kg., variety suitable for grain.
15. Barrel Clover Seed unprocessed, not less than 750g of each to be exhibited in glass jars.
16. Canola Seed, off the header, not less than 750g.

All bundles and sheaves must be at least 15cm in diameter at the tie and labelled by variety

- 17. Bundle of Green Wheaten Fodder, not in head.
- 18. Bundle of Green Barley, not in head.

Classes 19-27 inclusive must be exhibited WITH THE ROOTS, which must be washed and free from dirt

19. Bundle or Sheaf of Green Oats, in head, to be judged for potential grain production.
20. Bundle or Sheaf of Green Wheat, in head, to be judged for potential grain production. (Society's Certificate)
1st prize \$10.00, 2nd \$2.50, donated by AWB.
21. Bundle or Sheaf of Green Barley, in head, to be judged for potential grain production. (Trophy)
22. Bundle or Sheaf of Green Rye, in head, to be judged for potential grain production.
23. Bundle or Sheaf of Green Triticale, in head, to be judged for potential grain production.
24. Bundle of Green Lupins, to be judged for grain potential.
25. Bundle of Green Peas, to be judged for grain potential.
26. Bundle of Green Vetch, to be judged for grain potential.
27. Bundle of Canola, to be judged for grain potential.

All collections of cereals, grasses and fodders to be mounted for staging

28. Best Collection of Green Wheat, three varieties, grown by exhibitor. Each variety to be correctly named. **Ten plants only of each variety** to be exhibited with the roots and flag, and as taken from the field. Each variety to represent not less than four hectares.
