**CONDITIONS**

1. Dress – Competitors must be neatly and appropriately attired (as to judge a led horse class at a large agricultural show) with closed footwear suitable for the handling of livestock. Denim trousers, shorts and thongs are not permitted. Hats (not caps) are permitted and gentlemen are encouraged to wear a tie.
2. The Class will be conducted in accordance to the Rules and Regulations of the Agricultural Societies Council of SA Inc hand book.
3. Competitors are allowed two minutes per horse (timed) for assessment before they are asked to move to the next horse.
4. The competitors will complete the judging card for each of the four horses on the following segments with a comment (where desired) and score out of 30 points (5 points per section).
  - a) Neck and Head
  - b) Forelegs
  - c) Shoulder and Wither
  - d) Body and coupling
  - e) Hindquarters
  - f) Hindlegs
5. The competitors will complete the judging card for each of the four horses on the following segments with a comment (where desired) and a score out of 40 points (10 points per section).
  - a) Carriage and movement
  - b) Straightness of action
  - c) Manners
  - d) General Appearance
6. The competitor will then total the points for each horse (maximum 70 points) and the horse placed accordingly, i.e. the horse with the highest points being the winner.
7. Competitors then fill in the 'Oral' sheet with their placing and hand to the steward
8. The Over Judge will then speak with each competitor separately for a maximum of two minutes to ascertain the reasons behind the competitor's placing.
9. Young Judges will be scored on their - Presentation and dress, Accuracy of observation and Ability to compare animals, to determine the winner of the event.
