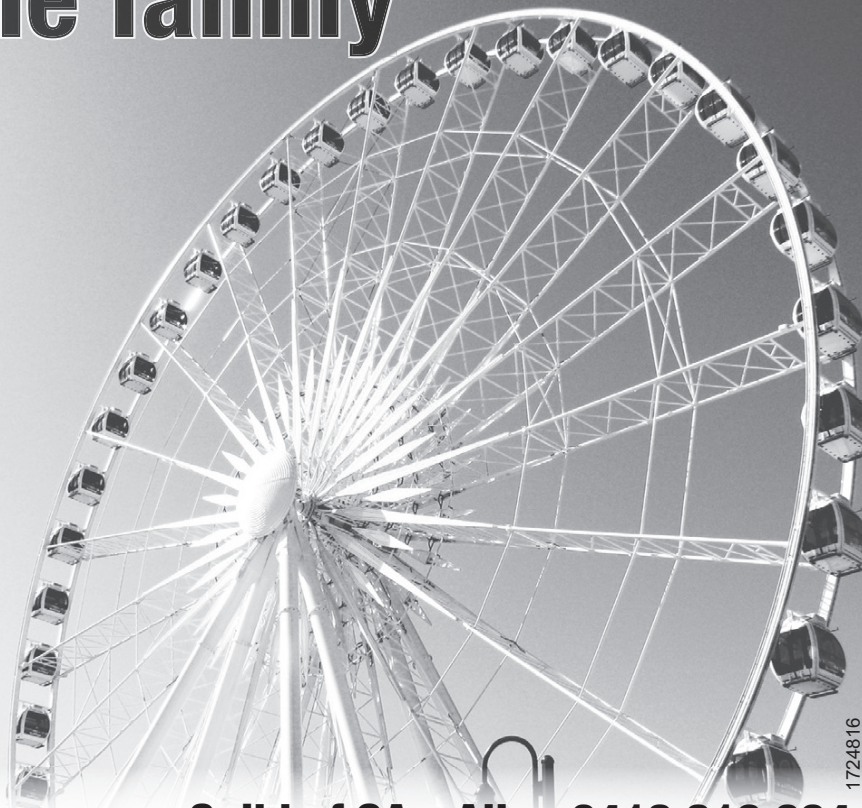

### ATTN – EXHIBITORS:

STEM – Means single bloom or bud.

BUD – A "bud" is defined as the stage of a rose to the time when colour is showing.

NND – Means not necessarily distinct.

13. 3 stems of any one variety of large flowered (Hybrid Tea) rose.  
One full bloom, one intermediate stage and one bud
14. Large flowered (Hybrid Tea) rose, 1 full bloom (Stamens Showing)
15. Climber Rose, 1 stem or cut (no minis)
16. David Austin rose, 3 stems or cuts
17. David Austin rose, 1 stem or cut
18. Heritage rose, 1 stem or cut (must be named)
19. Australian Bred Rose, 1 stem or cut (must be named)
20. Rose, single (no more than 8 petals) 1 stem or cut
21. Roses, not elsewhere enumerated, 3 stems or cuts NND (eg polyantha, hybrid musk, modern shrub)
22. Rose, not elsewhere enumerated, 1 stem or cut (eg polyantha, hybrid musk, modern shrub)
23. Bowl of large flowered roses, 6 to 12 stems or cuts. NND
24. Bowl of floribunda roses, 6 to 12 stems or cuts. NND.
25. Bowl of Miniature Roses, 6 to 12 stems or cuts. NND.
