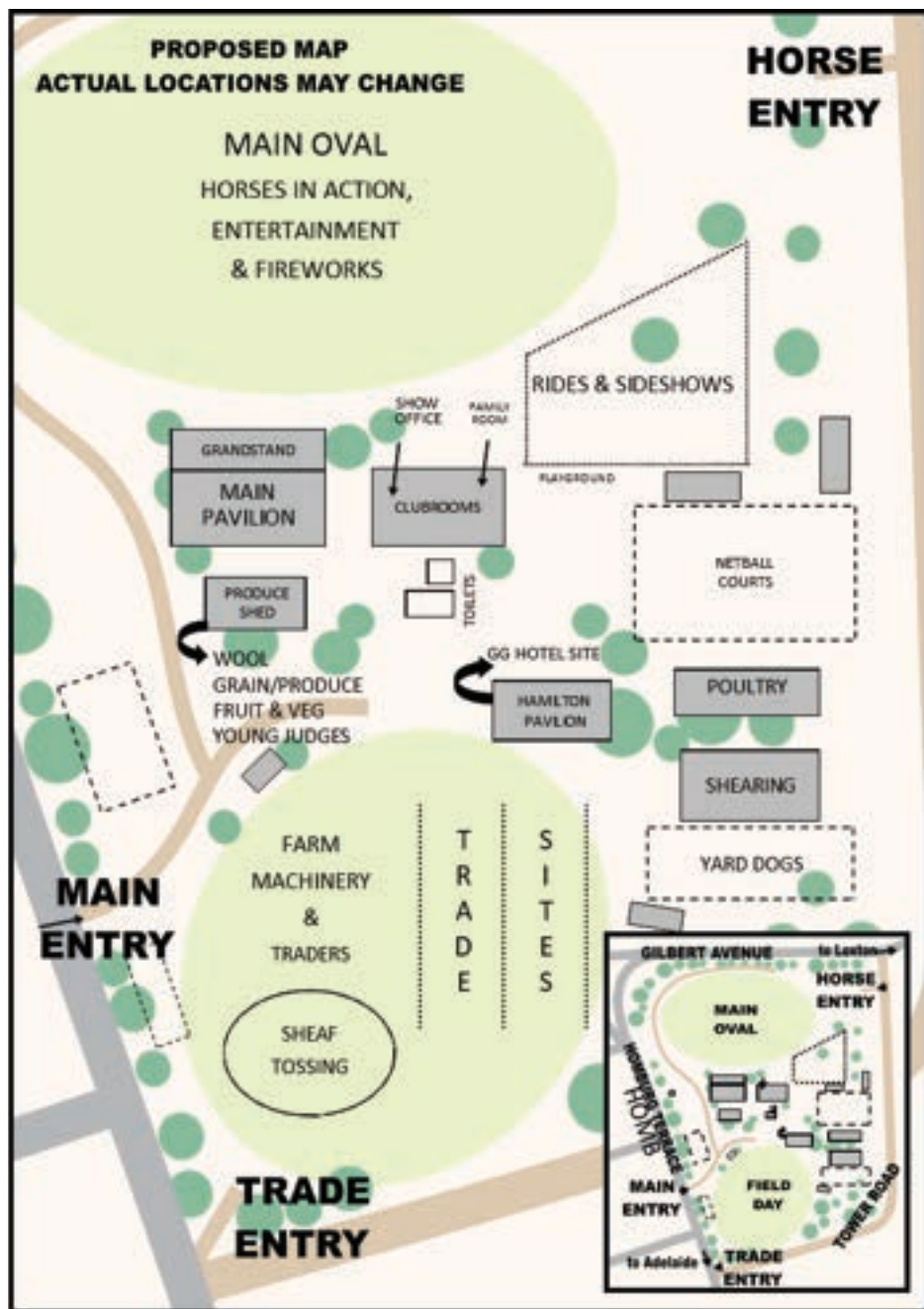

PINNAROO SHOW & FIELD DAY

The first Pinnaroo Show, held on 27th October 1910, set the standard for the annual event now regarded as one of the best country shows held in South Australia. The show has changed over the years, as the early shows featured many animals as part of everyday life on the farm, evolving over the last 115 years to add other attractions and concluding with a fireworks extravaganza.

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The annual subscription to the Show Society, which shall entitle the subscriber to full membership privileges, shall be:

Gold Membership	\$60	4 adult admission tickets and a free show book/schedule
Gold Family Membership	\$50	2 adult & 4 child admission tickets and a free show book/schedule
Silver Membership	\$40	3 adult admission tickets and a free show book/schedule
Bronze Membership	\$30	2 adult admission tickets and a free show book/schedule
Single Membership	\$20	1 adult admission ticket and a show book/schedule
Pensioner Membership	\$15	1 adult admission ticket and a show book/schedule
2. Admittance to the grounds shall be: Members - free on production of ticket; All motor cars - free; \$15 - Non-members, adults / \$10 - Pensioners / \$5 - School children
Persons wishing to leave the grounds & be re-admitted must obtain a pass-out at the gate.
3. All entry fees must be paid at or before the time at which entries close.
4. All subscriptions shall become due as from the first day of April each year, membership tickets to be forwarded to all prospective members after the executive committee has approved of same.
5. Entries for all classes close at the times stated within each section in the schedule.
6. All exhibits must be in place by the times designated and judging shall commence at the times stated within each respective section of the schedule.
7. No exhibitor's name to appear on any exhibit (except in the case of vehicles) until after prizes are awarded in that class, when tickets will be provided for the purpose.
8. No livestock, during judging, shall carry any previous prize ticket.
9. Articles for exhibition arriving after time for receiving exhibits may be exhibited by permission of the Secretary, not for competition, if placed where directed.
10. All the exhibits must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor, except in cases of Horses-In-Action.
11. All exhibits must be placed where directed. No exhibit will be accepted for competition until subscription fees and arrears (if any) are paid.
12. No prizes will be awarded unless an exhibit be deemed worthy by the judges, who may award a second and third prize in lieu of the first and second prizes. However, the judges should award first and second prizes in children's classes by way of encouragement. In all cases, their decision shall be final.
13. Any award made by the judges in contravention of regulations of the Society may be revised by the Committee.
14. The Society will not be responsible under any circumstances whatsoever for any accident, loss, negligence, theft, and/or damage howsoever caused on the grounds or premises of the Society, and it shall be a condition of entry that each shall hold the Society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceeding arising from or in respect of such accident, loss, negligence, theft or damage.
15. The same exhibit cannot be shown in two classes with the exception of horses.
16. The signing of the entry form for any exhibit is accepted by the Committee as a guarantee that the animal specified thereon is free from diseases as far as known to the owner, and in case of infectious disease being spread through or by any exhibit, the exhibitor only, and not the Society, shall be held responsible therefore.
17. Any exhibit which, in the opinion of the Committee, has been wrongfully or fraudulently entered, shall be disqualified, and the exhibitor disqualified from taking any prize at the show at which such exhibit has been so fraudulently or wrongfully entered. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse any entry or, if having received same, not to allow the exhibitor to compete, without assigning any reason therefore.
18. The Judge and Section Stewards have power to demand a statutory declaration from any person or persons, should they so desire, respecting any exhibits at the show, or as to the bona fides of any exhibitor or grower with respect to articles exhibited.
19. Interference with, or alteration of, entry or prize tickets by any person is strictly prohibited, and all exhibits of any competitor so interfering shall be liable to disqualification. The attention of the officials should be called to any error.

20. Any person damaging or stealing any exhibits will be prosecuted.
21. No exhibit other than livestock to be removed from the grounds before 6pm without consent of the Secretary.
22. Any person or persons insulting or interfering with the judges or officials during the show will be subject to removal from the grounds, and the prizes (if any) awarded to them shall be forfeited.
23. Exhibitors are responsible for the actions, doings or sayings of their authorized managers, agents or attendants.
24. The ruling of the Committee upon any point shall be final.
25. All protests must be lodged in writing with the Secretary before 4pm on the day of the show, except horses-in-action, which must be lodged within 30 minutes of the award being made. All protests to be accompanied by a deposit of \$1.00, same to be forfeited to the Society if protest not upheld.
26. Space for traders may be allotted on payment of fee.
27. No amplifying system shall be used on the grounds on the day of the show, except by written approval of the Executive Committee.
28. Applications for space for exhibits of machinery not for competition must be made in writing with the Secretary not later than seven clear days before the date of the show.
29. No person having applied for space under Rules 28 shall be permitted to occupy such space until all fees and arrears (if any) have been paid.
30. Every care will be taken of all exhibits entrusted to the Society, but the Committee refuses to accept any responsibility in case of loss or damage.
31. Tickets will be issued to all pavilion exhibitors. The pavilion will be cleared of all persons at 6pm, after which time entrance may be gained only for the purpose of collecting exhibits, on production of exhibitor's tickets.
32. Prize money will be paid on day of Show after 5pm from the Secretary's Office. All prize money not claimed within thirty days of the date of holding the show will be forfeited to the Society.
33. The Society reserves the right to postpone the date of the show or to abandon the show should it be deemed advisable to do so without incurring any liability by so postponing or abandoning.
34. In the event of a tied number of points for any award, based on points, a countback shall be conducted by a process of elimination, i.e. the winner shall be the exhibitor who has gained the most number of **first** prizes; if still tied, the most number of **second** prizes, and so on until positional prizes have been eliminated. Merit awards, Highly Recommended awards and all similar designations will then be used to decide the winner. Failing a decision, the number of entries placed by the exhibitors concerned in that section shall be considered.
35. The Murray Lands Agricultural Societies Association (MLASA) awards prizes for Horses-in-Action, Sheep, Wool, Poultry, Bantams, Pigeons, Grains, Flowers, Floral Art, Vegetables, Fruit, Jams & Preserves, Cookery, Needlework, Crafts, Photography and Art Sections held at Association Shows at Loxton, Pinnaroo & Karoonda. The MLASA Prize (or Association Prize) is awarded to the exhibitor gaining the highest number of points in a calendar year for each Open section listed, in a maximum of 20 classes per section (30 for Poultry; classes eligible may be marked with an asterisk. Eligible classes may be adjusted without notice at the convenor and/or Secretary's discretion). Exhibitors of all ages are eligible but only Open Classes will be included. A first prize counts as 3 points and a second as 2 points. In the event of a tie for the highest points, the MLASA reserves the right to perform a count back to determine the winner, or award joint winners. Confederacies are not eligible to compete or exhibit for Association Prizes. The word 'confederacy' in this clause does not refer to or include a registered partnership or firm where all the members or partners of the firm conduct regularly their business conjointly. The MLASA reserves the right to award these prizes either in cash, trophy, both or an alternative.
36. MLASA awards prizes for the Most Successful Junior Exhibitor at each Association Show (Pinnaroo, Loxton & Karoonda). The MLASA Most Successful Junior Prize is awarded to the Junior Exhibitor with highest number of points across all Junior Classes at a single Show (eligible classes may be adjusted without notice at the convenor and/or Secretary's discretion). A first prize counts as 3 points and a second as 2 points. Exhibitors must be 16 Years & Under to be eligible, and only Junior Classes will be included. In the event of a tie for the highest points, the MLASA reserves the right to perform a count back to determine the winner, or award joint winners. The MLASA reserves the right to award these prizes either in cash, trophy, both or an alternative.

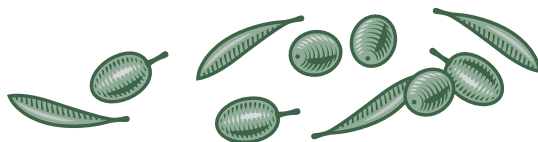

1. A total of 15 sheep will be used
2. Dogs must be kept quiet and away from the area while another dog is competing
3. Next competitor must be available with his/her dog 10 minutes before he/she is due to compete
4. Dogs biting or pulling wool will be penalised
5. At judge's discretion, dogs may be disqualified
6. Dogs wearing muzzles will be penalised 5 points
7. The competitor may retire at any time
8. Dogs taking excessive time will be rung off (12 minutes)
9. Scores from the elimination round will be posted on a board
10. The winning score shall be the best score in the finals
11. The judge's decision is final
12. Score sheets will be available after the finals
13. Competitors are to leave the gates as found or will be penalised
14. Competitors may assist the dog in keeping the sheep flowing, but excessive assistance will be penalised
15. Bitches on heat are not permitted on grounds
16. Vaccination certificates must be presented before the competitor will be allowed to compete. The dog must have been immunised against parvo virus, distemper and infectious hepatitis 14 days prior to, and within 12 months of date of competition
17. In the event of a draw, the score from the elimination round will be aggregated with the final score. If scores are still tied the dog with the fastest time in the final run shall be declared the winner
18. The organising committee reserves the right to alter any rules or regulations at any time
19. No whips are allowed, but a stick of less than 45cm will be allowed

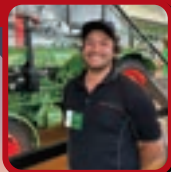

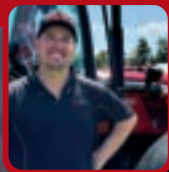

SOME HINTS AND JUDGING CRITERIA:

1. Do not brush milk or anything on to scones. Just dust off the flour after they have been baked.
2. Do not cut the ends off sponge rolls or nut loaves.
3. Lamington sizes are not critical, but they must be all of the same size.
4. When making lamingtons, use a proper lamington mixture, not sponge mixture.
5. If papering tins, have them very smooth (greaseproof paper or Glad Bake are the best).
Be careful when turning out cakes and **do not place on wire racks**. Any marks on the bottom
of cakes go against you. Alfoil tends to make a cake sweat. Tea towel may be better.
6. Evenness of size and height and texture are important.
7. The plate you put your entry on has no bearing on the points given.
8. Do not ice the sides of log cakes.
9. Points for judging are: 20 for appearance, 10 for evenness, 10 for texture and 10 for flavour.

Ingredients: 115g butter, 2 tablespoons water, 1 large tablespoon golden syrup, 1 teaspoon carb soda. *Dry ingredients* - 1 cup plain flour, 1 cup sugar, 1 cup coconut, 1 cup flaked oats.

Method: Put butter, water, golden syrup in a saucepan, bring to boil, add soda, pour onto mixed dry ingredients, mix well. Put in teaspoons full on greased tray. Bake in moderate to slow oven for 10 minutes.

- 1316** Honey Roll, using supplied recipe

Ingredients: 3 eggs, ½ cup sugar. 1 tablespoon melted honey. *Dry ingredients* - ½ cup corn flour, 2 heaped teaspoons plain flour, ½ level teaspoon carb soda, 1 level teaspoon cream of tartar, 1 teaspoon mixed spice, ½ teaspoon cinnamon

Method: Beat eggs well, add sugar, beat until nice and thick. Sift in dry ingredients. Lastly stir in melted honey. Bake in moderate oven for 10 -15 minutes. Fill with a cream filling.

- 1319** Apple Cake, using following recipe

Ingredients: 125g butter, 2 tablespoons sugar, 1 egg, 2 tablespoons water, 250g SR Flour, drained stewed apples.

Method: Cream butter, add sugar, add beaten egg, water and lastly flour. Turn onto floured board, roll out, put half mixture in 20cm round cake tin well lined with Glad Bake, put apples on top of mixture, put other half of dough on top of apples. Bake in moderate oven for 20 minutes. Ice when cold.

- 1322** Boiled Fruit Cake, using following recipe | Sponsor: Mrs Barb Thiel | 1st: \$5; 2nd: \$2.50

Ingredients: 1 cup SR flour, 1 cup plain flour, 2 eggs, 1 teaspoon carb soda. *Ingredients to boil* - 115g butter, 1 cup white sugar, 1 cup currants, 1 cup sultanas, 1 cup raisins, 1 teaspoon mixed spice, ¼ teaspoon salt, 58g mixed peel, 1 cup water.

Method: Put *Ingredients to boil* in a large saucepan, bring to a boil, simmer for 2 - 3 minutes. Take from heat, stir in carb soda. Allow to cool, sift together SR & Plain flours. Stir in well beaten eggs and sifted flours. Bake in greased and lined 20cm square tin, moderate to slow oven, for about 1½ hours.

- 1325** Potato Cake, using following recipe

Ingredients: ½ cup warm mashed potato, 1 tablespoon butter, 1 cup sugar, 1 egg (about 65g), 2 cups SR flour, pinch salt, ½ cup milk, ½ cup sultanas, 1 teaspoon vanilla. *Crumble Topping* - 60g butter, ½ cup sugar, ½ cup flour, pinch nutmeg

Method: Mix potato with butter, add sugar, mix well. Add beaten egg, vanilla and salt. Stir in SR flour and milk alternately, followed by sultanas. Place in 20cm square tin and cover with crumble. Bake in moderate oven for approximately 40 minutes.

Ingredients: 3 tablespoons butter, 1 cup sugar, ½ cup milk, ½ teaspoon vanilla, 2 level tablespoons cocoa, 1½ cups SR flour, 2 eggs

Method: Melt butter. Put all other ingredients into a large bowl. Pour melted butter on top. Beat hard for 3 minutes (electric beater). Bake in a moderate oven for about 50 minutes, in a 20cm tin.

Method Chop fruits, mix together and soak in the sherry or brandy overnight. Sift together flour, baking powder and spice. Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add fruit and flour and lastly chopped nuts. Mix thoroughly. Place mixture in a well prepared tin (square) 19-22cm, and bake in a slow oven for approximately three to three and a half hours.

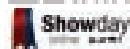

SOME HINTS FROM THE JUDGES:

- In knitting and crochet, watch for loose ends when finishing & use same colour for sewing up.
- Use buttons and ribbon suitable in size and type for articles.
- On quilts, make sure threads are tied off and trimmed.
- Make sure wadding goes right to the edges on binding for quilts, etc.
- On cross stitches, do not carry dark threads across on the back of aida cloth.
- Watch for loose threads on the back of work - run back under previous stitches.
- Do not use knots.
- Iron article well to remove creases.

Toys to be stuffed adequately so heads are not floppy.

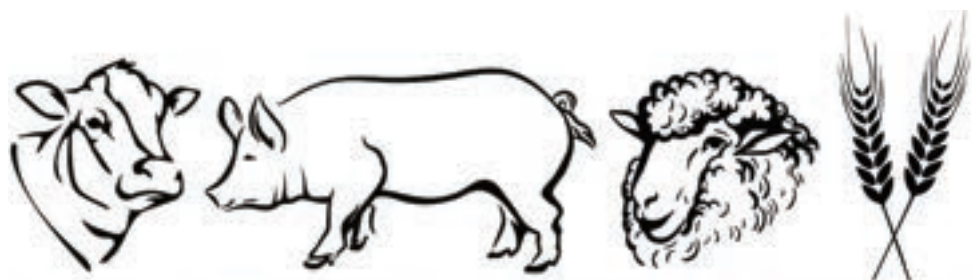
