- 1. Ponies, galloways and horses competing in Ring One CAN NOT compete in Ring Two or the Topsy Ring but are eligible for Led Breed Ring.
- 2. Ring two Encourage Ring is for competitors who do not regularly compete in Open or Qualifying events, HOTY or Royal events.
- 3. In the event of a dispute as to the age of any child a birth certificate must be produced.
- 4. All ponies must have height certificates where necessary.
- 5. Child's ponies to be ridden in a plain snaffle bit.
- 6. Disclaimer form MUST be completed prior to competing in any class.
- 7. THE JUDGES DECISION SHALL, IN ALL CASES, BE FINAL.
- 8. All prize money to be collected on the day. Any prizes not collected on the day will remain the property of Mil Lel A&H Show Society.
- 9. Australian approved helmets and appropriate riding boots to be worn when horse riding.

Prizes to be collected at the completion of each event, unless otherwise stated.

C.A.S.U.A.L. (Country Agricultural Shows Unaffiliated Amateur League)



RULES AND REGULATIONS of the MIL-LEL A & H SHOW SOCIETY INC.

- 1. Members Ticket: \$10-00. Admits the Member and one car to the Show.
- 2. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.
- 3. Entry fees must be paid at the time of entry.
- 4. Entries close with the secretary as stated in the program.
- 5. The Judges decision will be final, except where the regulations have been evaded. The Judges shall mark the number of which they have awarded the prize on the card provided by the secretary and the steward shall enter the name of the owner against such prize.
- 6. Protest should be lodged in writing and handed to the secretary within half an hour of the event in which the protest was made. A deposit of \$10 must accompany the protest and the deposit may be forfeited should the protest be deemed frivolous. The decision of the committee shall be final.
- 7. In the event of a dispute as to the age of any child, a birth certificate must be produced.
- 8. All horses must have height certificates where necessary.
- 9. Child's ponies to be ridden in a plain snaffle bit.
- 10. Stallions will only be eligible in classes set apart for them and the jumping classes.
- 11. All competitors compete at their own risk.
- 12. All competitors must be ready as each class is called.
- 13. All riders must wear approved helmets and riding boots.
- 14. The committee will not accept any responsibility for any exhibit either for competition or exhibition.
- 15. The committee reserves the right to disqualify and prevent any person from exhibiting at the show for such time as the association may determine if such person shall at any time insult judges or stewards or be guilty of unseemly conduct on the showground.
- 16. All exhibitors and competitors to pay admission to enter grounds.
- 17. In the case of tied points the exhibitor winning the most first prizes wins trophy.
- 18. Dogs to be on a lead at showground except for demonstrations and exhibitions.
- 19. Any trade stall or display to have written permission from the secretary and president.
- 20. If a vet is called it will be at the expense of the owner whose animal is being treated.
